PREPARING FOR A SAFE RETURN TO SCHOOL

School administrators need to engage and encourage everyone in the school and the community to practice infection preventive behaviors. These are the most important actions that will support schools' safe reopening and will help them stay open.

Key considerations for school administrators:

- Approaches to cohorting that fit the needs of your

school/district and community (e.g., keeping students in class pods, staggering when students return to school facility, having the same teacher stay with the same group of students).

- Maintain healthy environments (e.g., cleaning and disinfecting frequently touched surfaces).
- Concurrently implementing multiple strategies in school to prevent the spread of COVID-19 (e.g., social distancing, cloth face coverings, hand hygiene, and use of cohorting).

SOCIAL DISTANCING

Modified Layouts

- Space seating/desks at least 6 feet apart when feasible.
- Turn desks to face in the same direction (rather than facing each other), or have students sit on only one side of tables, spaced apart.
- Create distance between children on school buses (e.g., seat children one child per row, skip rows) when possible

Physical Barriers and Guides

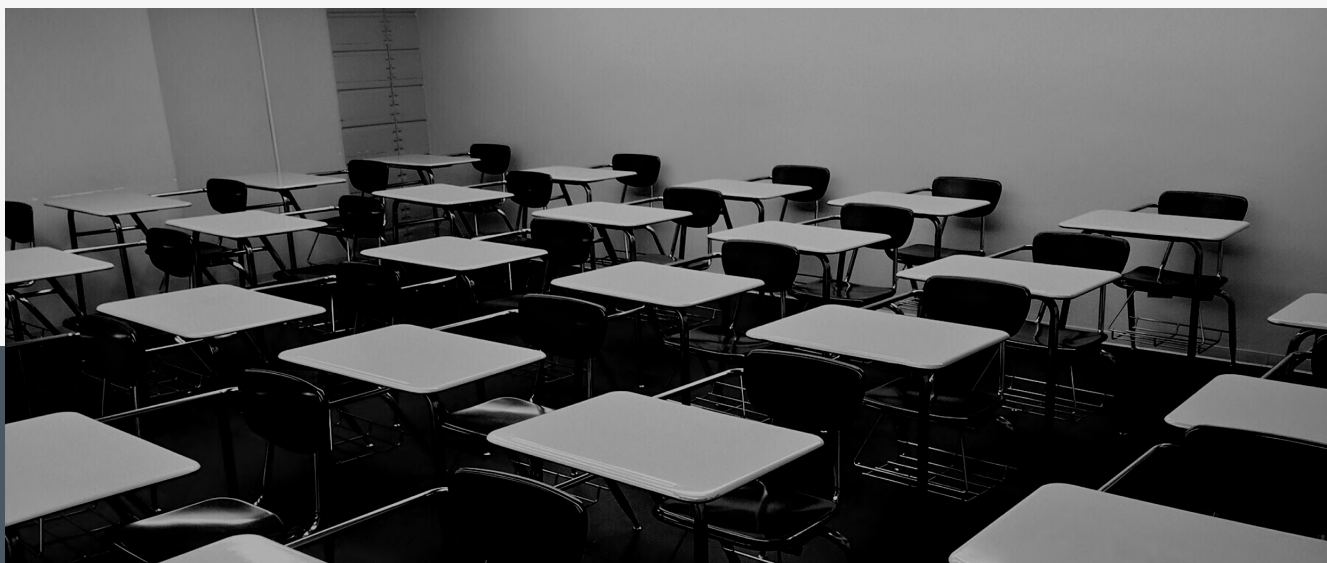
- Install physical barriers, such as sneeze guards and partitions, particularly in areas where it is difficult for individuals to remain at least 6 feet apart (e.g., reception desks).
- Provide physical guides, such as tape on floors or sidewalks and signs on walls, to ensure that staff and children remain at least 6 feet apart in lines and at other times (e.g. guides for creating "one way routes" in hallways).

Communal Spaces

- Close communal use shared spaces such as dining halls and playgrounds with shared playground equipment if possible; otherwise, stagger use and clean and disinfect between use.
- Add physical barriers, such as plastic flexible screens, between bathroom sinks especially when they cannot be at least 6 feet apart.

Food Service

- Have children bring their own meals as feasible, or serve individually plated meals in classrooms instead of in a communal dining hall or cafeteria.
- Use disposable food service items (e.g., utensils, dishes). Or, ensure that all non-disposable food service items are handled with gloves and washed with dish soap and hot water or in a dishwasher.



OPERATING SCHOOLS DURING COVID-19

GUIDING PRINCIPLES TO KEEP IN MIND

Based on the CDC's Guidelines for Reopening Schools, the more people a student or staff member interacts with, and the longer that interaction, the higher the risk of COVID-19 spread. The risk of COVID-19 spread increases in school settings as follows:

Low Risk:

Students and teachers engage in virtual-only classes, activities, and events.

Medium Risk:

Small, in-person classes, activities, and events. Groups of students stay together and with the same teacher throughout/across school days and groups do not mix. Students remain at least 6 feet apart and do not share objects (e.g., hybrid virtual and in-person class structures, or staggered/rotated scheduling to accommodate smaller class sizes).

High Risk:

Full sized, in-person classes, activities, and events. Students are not spaced apart, share classroom materials or supplies, and mix between classes and activities.

PROVIDE OPTIMAL LEARNING ENVIRONMENTS FOR STUDENTS

HYGIENE PREVENTION SUPPLIES, FEVER SCREENING AND OCCUPANCY TRACKING TECHNOLOGY



Teach and reinforce the use of cloth face coverings. Face coverings may be challenging for students (especially younger students) to wear in all-day settings such as school. Face coverings should be worn by staff and students (particularly older students) as feasible and essential when physical distancing is difficult.

Support healthy hygiene behaviors by providing adequate supplies, including soap, hand sanitizer with at least 60 percent alcohol (for staff and older children who can safely use hand sanitizer), paper towels, tissues, disinfectant wipes, cloth face coverings (as feasible) and no-touch/foot-pedal trash cans.

Conduct daily health checks (e.g., temperature screening or symptom checking) of staff and students.

BACK-TO-SCHOOL CHECKLIST

PROMOTE BEHAVIORS THAT REDUCE SPREAD



1. Educate staff and families about when they/their children should stay home and return to school.
2. Teach and reinforce handwashing with soap and water for at least 20 seconds and increase monitoring to ensure adherence among students and staff.
3. If soap and water are not readily available, hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol can be used (for staff and older children who can safely use hand sanitizer).
4. Teach and reinforce the use of cloth face coverings. Face coverings should be worn by staff and students as feasible, and are essential in times when physical distancing is difficult.
5. Encourage staff and students to cover coughs and sneezes with a tissue.
6. Post signs in highly visible locations that promote everyday protective measures and describe how to stop the spread.
7. Clean and disinfect frequently touched surfaces within the school and on school buses daily or between use as much as possible.
8. Space seating/desks at least 6 feet apart when feasible.
9. Ensure ventilation systems operate properly and increase outdoor air circulation as much as possible, for example, by opening windows and doors.
10. Install physical barriers, such as sneeze guards and partitions, particularly in areas where it is difficult for individuals to remain at least 6 feet apart.
